

Why Cats need their claws

1 Clawing is a natural, healthy and necessary behavior for cats



this is an innate behavior coded in their DNA

Scratching and clawing helps kitties to:

- shed the dead outer husk of their nail to expose the new healthy nail underneath
- deposit their scent from glands in their feet
- offer visual and olfactory territorial markers
- use the resistance created during scratching to stretch their leg and back muscles
- play an important role in their muscle tone and agility

Declawing is amputation



equivalent to cutting a human finger off at the first knuckle

This is life-changing surgery that can cause chronic physical issues:

- Cats have to re-learn how to walk after surgery just as a human would if they lost parts of their toes. 50% of decalwed cats develop complications.
- They can have long-lasting issues with mobility, dexterity, grooming, and balance.
- Cats can develop arthritis, bone spurs, and nerve damage.
- Surgical risks include infection and pain and inflammation from fragments of bone left behind, lameness, and chronic pain in their paws and backs

3 Declawing causes behavioral issues



33% of declawed cats develop at least one behavioral issue

Cats that have been declawed are more likely to develop emotional issues:

7x more likely to have litter box issues or inappropriate marking

more likely to be aggressive and fearful more likely to overgroom due to stress and anxiety more likely to be diagnosed with chronic pain

4 Declawing is banned across the world and in parts of the US



Additional states and countries have decalwing bans in legislative review

Banned, deemed inhumane, ethically unacceptable, and unnecessary in:

39 countries including England, Scotland, Italy, Germany, France, Israel, Australia, Japan, Sova Scotia, British Columbia, and Quebec.

10 parts of the US including New York state, Denver, Los Angeles, San Francisco, and our capital city of Madison, among others.
